



General Rules

- 1. All Exhibits must have been produced or made since the last fair by the person whose name appears on the tag as exhibitor.
- 2. All Indoor Exhibitors must obtain an exhibitor number and an official entry tag for each exhibit. Advanced registration is recommended to save time, but not required, complete the general entry form in this book by June 1st and mail to: Bev Leibensperger, 20 Pauley Ln, Kempton, Pa. 19529 or email: kemptonfairexhibits@gmail.com Do not mail your exhibits, only entry form. Entry forms received less then five days before entries are due on the fairgrounds are not guaranteed to be pre-entered, but will be entered. Exhibits will be received on the Wednesday of Fair Week, between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in the Main Exhibit Hall. Exception: Special Baking Contest 15-04-01 thru 15-04-06 which will only be accepted Thursday of Fair Week between 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.. Those who did not pre-register may enter their exhibits at this time.
- 3. Livestock entries are due by May 20, 2025. Complete and mailed to: Morgan Kamp, 211 Church Hill Rd, Lenhartsville, PA 19534, Attn: Livestock. If stall capacity is reached before the entry closing date, first come basis will be used. Livestock are due on the fairgrounds between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Wednesday of Fair Week. *ALL Market Hogs must be received by 11:00 a.m.* Market Animals will be weighed as they come off the truck.
- 4. An exhibitor may enter as many Departments, Sections and Classes as he or she wishes, but only one entry per class is allowed per exhibitor, except in the livestock classes where specified.
- 5. Only entries that fit present Departments and Classes will be accepted. You are responsible to decide the Department and Class for you entries, the fair can not.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged at the times listed under the department and must remain on display during the fair.
- 7. Space for competitive exhibits is limited. The fair reserves right to limit the number of entries in any department of the fair on a first come basis.
- 8. Any exhibitor may be required to prove ability to reproduce entry in any department in the presence of a qualified person designated by the fair.
- 9. Superintendents reserve the right to bar from competition entries decidedly inferior in quality. Food products can not be polluted with any substance or chemical that causes them to become poisonous or unfit to be used as food.

- 10. Final administration and interpretation of these rules and regulations will be vested in the fair management and their decision will be final.
- 11. Joint ownership will considered to be as one owner in accordance with registration papers.
- 12. If there are not enough entries in a Class, items may be combined with others to make a contest. The superintendent's decision will be final.
- 13. All items and articles entered must be clean, free of spoilage, and suitable for public display.
- 14. While due care will be taken of all entries, and security provided, the Fair Association will not be responsible for loss or damage.
- 15. Exhibits are to be picked up the Sunday after the fair ends (Fathers day) between 10:00 A.m. and 1:00 P.m..
- 16. All premium checks will be mailed within 2 weeks of close of the fair. If you have any problems or questions regarding your check you have 4 weeks from the close of the fair to bring it to our attention. This can be done by <a href="mailto:em
- 17. Anyone earning premiums over \$600.00 will have to provide us with there Social Security Number, for a 1099 before check will be sent.
- 18. Kempton Fair is not responsible for typographical errors in this book.
- 19. Any questions regarding entries feel free to email: info@kemptonfair.org
- 20. Pa Department of Agriculture regulations state that only animals on exhibit and service animals shall be permitted on the fairgrounds. NO PETS, NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 21. ALCOHOL and COOLERS are prohibited on the fairgrounds.



NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times report them-selves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibitions in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any fact relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible per-sons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials. Junior exhibitors are expected to car for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 3. Junior Exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the fair and livestock show.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs ad-ministered in accordance with federal, sate and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animals performance of appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood or other sample taken from live-stock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample

was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counter-irritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedure performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or chow officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons wither by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of any penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statues, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

GUIDELINES FOR CARE OF ANIMALS

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to care for animals in a manner that is responsible and ethical.

General Livestock Rules

- 1). <u>All livestock and dairy entries must be RECEIVED no later than</u> May 20, 2025 at 5:00 p.m.. All entry fees must accompany entry form and be paid prior to check in. (See form on page 37).
- 2). Late entries will not be accepted. No exceptions. A \$15 scratch fee will be imposed for dairy after June 10th.
- 3). With limited barn space, and a growing number of entries, every effort will be made to accommodate all entries. In the event that entry numbers exceed pen space, the Fair Committee reserves the right to limit the number of head per exhibitor and/or accept entries on a first come, first serve basis.
- 4). All cattle, sheep and goat entries must be accompanied by an authentic Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 13, 2025 by a licensed veterinarian. The CVI must state that all animals entered are free of contagious disease and must not be known to have been exposed to contagious disease for at least 30 days prior to entry to fairgrounds. (Any changes to regulations issued by PDA after 1/30/25 will supersede this rule). PLEASE SEE LIVESTOCK AND DAIRY SECTIONS FOR ANY ADDITIONAL SPECIES-SPECIFIC RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- 5). The Fair Committee reserves the right to refuse or dismiss any entries suspected of contagious disease (including soremouth and scabies), along with the entire exhibit. Animals determined by the Fair Committee to be in poor flesh condition, exhibiting abscesses, or deemed unsuitable for public display will be required to be removed from the fairgrounds on an individual basis.
- 6). Animals not to be exhibited may not remain on the fairgrounds. This includes animals refused/dismissed, as well as companion animals and pets. NO DOGS/PETS ALLOWED! (This does not pertain to service animals).
- 7). All entries must comply with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture regulations governing transportation and/or exhibition of livestock.
- 8). All animals intended for exhibit at Kempton Fair <u>must be owned by</u>, and in possession of, the exhibitor no later than May 15, 2025.
- 9). Eligible exhibitors may enter as both Open and Junior (aged 8-19 as of January 1, 2025).
- 10). All Market Livestock will be weighed at check in and assigned to classes by the Fair Committee based on weight and number of entries. All decisions are final.
- 11). Fitting and Showmanship classes will be determined by the Fair Committee based on age and number of exhibitors within each species. Due to variations in ages and numbers of entrants, it is possible that an exhibitor might not be assigned to the same age group in all species.
- 12). All entries must be properly identified according to specific guidelines found within the section for each species. This must be done before entering the fairgrounds.
- 13). No person shall be allowed in the ring during judging except the judges, superintendents, and necessary attendants as appointed by the Fair Committee. Violation of this rule will result in disqualification and forfeiture of premiums.
- 14). Barn Fans, if necessary, must be hanging type only and approved by the Livestock Committee. No floor, pedestal, box, or household fans will be permitted for use at the fair.
- 15). Exhibitors are expected to provide their own bedding, feed and care for their stock for the duration of the fair. In addition, they are expected to maintain stalling areas, pens, tack/feed pens and walkways to ensure they are clean, presentable, and easily accessible to the public. Violation of this rule may result in penalties determined at the discretion of the Fair Committee.
- 16). The fair will take necessary precautions to ensure the safety of its exhibitors and their stock. However, they will not be responsible for damage or loss due to fire, theft, or other occurrences during the fair.
- 17). Any exhibitor who violates any rule is subject to forfeiture of premiums and subject to other penalties at the discretion of the Fair Committee.
- 18). All minor exhibitors staying over night MUST be accompanied by a parent/adult.
- 19). All Livestock exhibitors agree to follow the International Association of Fair and Expositions National code of Show Ring Ethics as listed on page 8 of this premium book.
